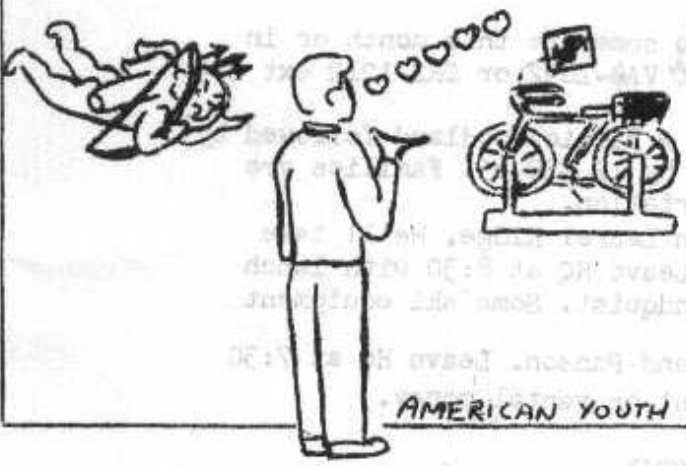

Located a little northwest of Bedford, it offers a 1000' vertical rise and numerous excellent slopes for beginners and experts alike. The trip is planned for sometime in February or early March. The cost will be \$18 to \$22 depending on the number of participants. The trip will leave early on a Saturday morning and return about 7 PM Sunday evening. Skis and poles will be available from AYH at a very low rental for those who lack their own equipment.

We of the new Syracuse Hostel Council hope very much that in your follow-up of hostelling inquiries for Mr. Cosgrove's project you will be able to use some of our Syracuse Hostel fliers and let your prospects know the scenic interest in Central New York.

Because ours is a city hostel, we admit autos and other not-on-your-own-steamtrippers. The folder shows how much of interest there is in and near Syracuse. Members of the Syracuse Hostel Club would be glad to act as guides if desired. We have supplementary accommodations in the neighborhood well beyond the number given in the handbook. Syracuse Hostel is open year-round.

We are working toward a chain of hostels along the old Erie Canal, so that one can hike or bike on the old towpath. We already have had canal canoe trips.

We expect many hostellers from your area will go to the World's Fair and use the fine Mitchell Fair Hostel. Do suggest their coming or returning via Niagara Falls (Lewiston supplementary Hostel) and also spending two or three days at Syracuse. We realize this adds many miles, but it would certainly be worth the extra time. We encourage families as well as groups and individuals.
